How much does living in St Kitts and Nevis cost as a retiree? Is local produce cheap? How expensive is St Kitts and Nevis for a family of four? The average utilities, rent, and grocery prices make the Caribbean island an appealing option for foreign nationals. A single person can live comfortably in St Kitts and Nevis with a monthly budget of between \$1,500 to \$2,000. A family of four's monthly expenses range between \$2,800 and \$4,000; however, monthly costs will vary significantly depending on factors such as owning a vehicle, using public transportation, paying for private schooling, or higher education.

A single person or family of four estimated monthly costs can be reduced by buying local produce, but like many Caribbean countries, imported goods are more expensive than those from the US and European countries.

Due to the high volume of imported food products in St. Kitts and Nevis, grocery costs can range from moderate to expensive; however, retirees in St Kitts and Nevis who buy local products at markets significantly reduce these expenses.

Locally produced products include onions, oranges, peanuts, sugarcane, coconuts, soursop, and breadfruit. Like in other Caribbean islands, imported food such as milk, eggs, fresh white bread, and imported wine is more expensive than average.
