

Solar energy taipei

The Taiwanese government plans to increase the share of renewable energies in electricity generation from currently 5.56 % to 20 % by 2025. The primary focus will be on the expansion of solar energy. Until 2025 the government intends to increase the installed capacity of photovoltaic plants up to 20 GW. Currently they only amounted to about 5.8 GW. Around 89 billion TWD will be invested in the development of ground-mounted systems alone.

In Taiwan, Germany is considered a pioneer of the energy transition and German companies enjoy an excellent reputation. For German companies, Taiwan is a promising market and offers considerable opportunities in the solar energy sector. There are potentials for German suppliers of substructures for rooftop and ground-mounted systems, including floating PV. Additionally, opportunities arise for suppliers of specialized solutions for agri-photovoltaics and fisheries solar power plants. There is also market potential for providers of cleaning solutions for PV systems and financing of solar systems.

The virtual business trip "Solar Industry in Taiwan" offers German companies the opportunity to present their products and services to a Taiwanese trade audience. Furthermore, DEInternational Ltd, the service unit of the German Trade Office Taipei, sets up individual business meetings for each participating company to meet with relevant decision-makers and potential business partners from Taiwan. The virtual business trip is part of the German Energy Solutions Initiative funded by the Federal Ministry for Economic Affairs and Energy.

Moreover, the solar power generated on Monday surpassed the total installed capacity of the nation's major coal-fired power plants, including Datan Power Plant () in Taoyuan, Kaohsiung's Hsinta Power Plant () and Taichung Power Plant, Taipower said in a statement on Monday.

Solar energy supplied about 15 percent of total power consumption on Monday noon, the state-owned utility said.

Due to high temperatures, peak-hour power consumption surged to 39.516 gigawatts at 2pm on Monday -- surpassing peak-hour records for August, it said.

Overall, the nation saw its installed solar power capacity rise to 7.65 gigawatts at the end of last year,

compared with 1.25 gigawatts in 2016, thanks to efforts by the government and local companies in establishing solar farms over the years, Taipower said in the statement.

Taiwan last night blanked world No. 1 Japan 4-0 to win the World Baseball Softball Confederation's (WBSC) Premier12 for the first time. Taiwanese ace Lin Yu-min () held defending champions Japan to just one hit and no runs in the first four innings, before catcher Lin Chia-cheng () opened the fifth inning with a solo home run. Taiwan yesterday advanced to the gold medal match of the World Baseball Softball Confederation's (WBSC) Premier12 for the first time in history, despite last night losing 9-6 to Japan. Taiwan advanced after the US defeated Venezuela in the first game on the last day of the Super Round. However, the US had no chance of advancing to the championship game unless it defeated Venezuela by at least nine points. The US won 6-5.
